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For those who know me, you will realise I like to keep things fresh, relevant and interesting for the children, taking the children's opinions into account (pupil voice).

As a result we are changing the way Friday's assemblies are organised and delivered. Rather than awarding Star of the Week each week in the hall, this will be done in the classrooms as the children will understand the reasons why they are being congratulated even more. Equally, the children will receive recognition throughout the week for their efforts, enthusiasm and engagement in reading, rather than waiting until Friday when the moment has passed.

Children who live out our Gospel Values will be celebrated in the school hall which helps to keep our mission (Growing together in God's love) more meaningful to the children. Friday's assemblies will also provide the children with a platform to speak to the whole school and develop oracy skills as they will be asked to perform tasks such as: share their learning, give a book review, read a poem, give factual information etc. Guest speakers will also be invited to talk to the children about various topics.

I will be asking the children for their feedback about assemblies in due course.

The staff and I have been busy creating our next School Improvement Plan for this academic year. Once finalised, I will be sending a parental version home so that you can help and work with school in making further improvements to benefit our children.

The termly parent forums will continue, giving parents opportunity to discuss school improvements with me and give the parental point of view (parent voice) which can prove to be invaluable. The autumn term date for parents forum will be Monday, 13th November at 4.30pm in the school hall.

All are invited.

Finally, things are tightening up where attendance and punctuality are concerned.
