For those who don't know, Parkrun is a free, weekly event where you can run, jog or walk around the course; it is all inclusive, there is no time limit and no one finishes last.

Parkrun happens all across the country at 9.00am every Saturday morning (5km) and at 9.00am for junior parkrun (2km).

To take part, all you need is a barcode.

To get a barcode: search for Parkrun on the internet, click register, then complete the online form.

Junior parkrun is for children aged 4-14 (adults are allowed to run/walk/accompany children throughout the event). It would be amazing to see as many children from our school taking part. The actual date is still to be confirmed, but in the meantime you can get your barcodes ready!
