Please be wary of text messages that you receive this Black Friday weekend. Scammers are sending 'Hello Mum' text messages from unknown numbers. These may ask you to click on a link to access a 'Black Friday deal' in an attempt to steal personal information.

When is my child too ill for school?

As we are working hard to improve attendance across the school, it can be quite difficult to decide sometimes if your child should attend when they are feeling unwell. With this in mind, this chart has been created to help parents and carers make that judgement call.

Please do use it and refer to it when needed.

Type of illness	Should my child attend school	How long should child be off school?	Further comments
Coughs and colds	Yes—if minor cough and cold	0	
Cough and cold with fever	No	Until fever goes	
High temperature	No	Until temperature has returned to normal	
Chicken pox	No	Until spots have crusted over	
Cold sores	Yes	0	
Conjunctivitis	Yes	0	
Covid	Yes— if only symptoms are runny nose, sore throat or slight cough and they feel well enough. No—if they have a high temperature and don't feel well enough	Until they are well enough (avoid contact with others for 3 days)	
diarrhoea	No	48 hours after last episode	
Ear infection	Yes if also have symptoms of high temperature or is severe	Until feeling better	
Hand, foot and mouth disease	Yes	0	
Head lice and nits	Yes	0	
Impetigo	No	Until sores have crusted over	
Ringworm	Yes—once they have started treatment	0	
Scarlet fever	Yes—24 hours after starting antibiotics	Until they start anti- biotics	
Slapped cheek syndrome	Yes	0	
Sore throat	Yes—unless they also have a high temperature		
threadworms	Yes	0	
Vomiting	No	48 hours after last episode
