This is 5km a day but it doesn't have to be 5km all in one go instead it can be spread out over the day such as the walk to and from school or if you do a 15-minute cycle this is equivalent to a 5km walk. Your effort and participation are appreciated regardless of whether you achieve the 5km a day target or not so please get walking every little bit counts!
