In English, we have had a busy week in school designing and making and learning French. What a fantastic week it has been. In today's assembly we were impressed with all the designs and creations made from each year group; staff were particularly impressed with the language and vocabulary the children used to tell others about what they have learnt.

Please do keep talking to your children about their learning at school as this really does help the children to know more, remember more and be more articulate and confident when speaking out loud. We are giving the children many opportunities in school to develop their oracy skills (speaking aloud) and skills in holding a meaningful conversation. This is part of our school improvement plan for this year. Incorporating subject specific vocabulary is an important aspect of oracy skills as it helps to embed their new learning from short term to long term memory. Any help at home (consider this to be extra homework!) is much appreciated and definitely benefits the children in many ways. Thank you for your continued support.

Another important area on our school improvement plan is reading. As you know, reading is vital in increasing vocabulary, imagination, knowledge and understanding of grammar, spelling and, importantly, is fun! We have come a long way with reading in school (phonics, library, reading diaries, visits to library to name a few actions) and children understand how important reading is. I am now giving adults a chance to lead by example. Some of you may have noticed we have a new bookshelf in the entrance area. This is for you to use and a 'bring and borrow' library service for our parents and grandparents. It is a little bare at the moment so if you have any books you no longer need/want you can donate them to our bookcase and borrow the books that take your fancy...all for free (you can just borrow without donating first!)

I know many of you will be avid readers already, but here is your chance to really engage with reading and showing the children that reading for pleasure is a great way to spend your time (instead of a screen!)

Computing week



Information Technology Focus

Next week, we will continue our learning in computing in another information technology focus! Information Technology is the ability to use computer programs and combine outcomes from different applications to create specific content that is appropriate to purpose and audience.

In our last focus on information technology, each year group used spreadsheets to present information in a variety of different ways and inputted formulae for the spreadsheets to automatically calculate based on the data given in specific cells. We thought about how these can help us with information we already have at hand.

Next week, we will think about other ways that such information can be presented using technology and how we can understand these, as well as how we can use the internet to effectively search for the information. Here's what each class will be learning about:

Year 1 - Animated story books using 2Create a Story.

Difference between traditional books and e-books, to add animation and save changes, to add sound effects and voice recordings, adding backgrounds, copying and pasting.

Year 2 - Questioning using 2Question and 2Investigate

Understanding information on pictograms, Yes/No questions, Using binary trees and search tools.

Year 3 - Presenting using Microsoft Powerpoint

Creating pages, adding media, adding shapes and lines, adding animations, design and present effective presentations.

Year 4 - Animation and Effective Searching using 2Animate and Search Engines

How animations are created, add backgrounds and sounds, stop motion animation.

Locate information on search results, use search effectively to find information, assess whether information source is reliable.

Year 5 - Word Processing using Microsoft Word

Making a document from a blank page, inserting and editing images, using word wrap, adding and changing text, enhancing usability, using letter templates, consider page layout including headings and columns.

Year 6 - Quizzing using 2Quiz

Create a picture based quiz, question types, grammar quizzes, searching databases.
