St Thomas of Canterbury Mums on the Run!

Did you know that St Thomas of Canterbury has a social running group especially for mums?

We meet every Tuesday evening at 7.15pm at the school car park, and cover around 5km whilst having a good chat!

Everyone is welcome, no matter what your level of fitness. We're very friendly and always make sure nobody is running on their own, so even if you haven't run in years come and get involved!

N.B. This group is not affiliated with any organisation. No one person is responsible. Everyone is responsible for their own safety / belongings etc.

Children in Reception, Y1 and Y2 are eligible for a universal free school meal. If preferred your child can bring in a packed lunch, however please inform the office if they change from taking a school meal to a packed lunch. Please note that in-order to manage meal numbers we ask that children stay with their chosen option for a least a half-term.

School meals for children in Y3 to Y6 are payable unless eligible for a free school meal. This year the cost of a school meal is £2.50 per day (£12.50 per week) which is payable in advance by the Monday.

Payments are to be made via our on-line payments system 'school money'

Out of Hours Club

Booking for the breakfast or afterschool club is accessed through school money.

Bookings should be made in advance and must be paid for at the time of booking. Please note that you will be unable to book on this system for emergency care i.e. on the day.

The procedure for emergency out of hours care is as follows:

- credit your account via school money for the relevant cost of the session plus an extra £2.50 for the late booking fee.
 - Text the out of hours club on 07434360183 to let them know your child will be attending.
 - Mrs Murphy will input the booking along with the late booking fee on the system and text a message back to ok, this will be done around 3pm as the out of hours club staff are not in school during the school day.

Charges for breakfast and afterschool club are as follows:

Breakfast club: Cost is £5, which includes breakfast - Drop off from 7.50am onwards

Afterschool club: There are 2 session bands as follows:

From 3.10/315pm - up to 4.30pm, including snack - cost will be £6.25 Pick up after 4.30pm up to 5.30pm - cost will be £8.00

New Parents

School Money—Cashless System

Our new reception parents will receive a welcome text and email message over the next few days to enable you to access our school money on-line payments system. If you have any problems logging on please contact the school office.

As we are a cashless school, all dinner money, milk money, after school & breakfast club monies and any trip monies etc. will require payments to be made on-line.

Polite Reminders

- Gates will be open from 8.40am— 8.55am and children will be expected to be in class and settled by 9.00am.
- Reception, Years 1 & 2 finish at 3.10pm
- Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 finish at 3.15pm.
- Full uniform to be worn and if the weather is warm, summer dresses or school shorts can be worn.
 - Parents please do not use the staff car park when dropping off or picking up children. This includes when using the out of hours club, after school or morning activity clubs and nursery.
 - All items of uniform should be clearly labelled with your child's name.
