Outline of Come and See topics.

Topic One:	In this subject we look at God's unconditional Love
<u>-</u>	for us. We start by looking at the people around us
Theme: Family	that love us and the different ways that they show
Topic: Loving	that love. We then move on to looking at God's unconditional love for us, how God shows us that love to us and how that love should affects our actions towards how we treat others and ourselves. In this topic we look at the Parable of the Prodigal Son and The Beatitudes as well as a number of different scriptures that describe what love should look like. Topic Two:	class as a vocation. We identify what is required of
Theme: Belonging	these individuals and the sacrifice and commitment
Topic: Vocation and Commitment	they show by doing their jobs. We then move onto the call that we have as we join God's family to spread the Good Word. After that a few lessons are spend looking at the vocation of a Priest and the Sacrament of Ordination. We look in depth at the call individuals receive to a religious life and the Vows they may take. After all of this we take time to think about what our Vocation may be and write a personal record about how we can serve others in the way that God has called us to as part of his family.
Topic Three:	In this topic we start by thinking about the

Topic: Expectations	ourselves. We discuss whether it is good to have high expectations of people. We then talk about

We look at Isaiah's prophecies of Jesus birth and different people's experiences at this time including Mary and John the Baptist. We then spend a bit of time looking at our expectations that Jesus will come again.

Theme: Local Church	of books that we know and sharing our favourite books with each other. We then look at the way that

In this topic the children will look at the different books in the bible, their purpose and things that we can learn from them. We also look at how we can put those teachings into our everyday life. The children spend a lot of time learning how to handle a Bible and use the different tools it has to find the information that they want.
