#### **Year 6 End of Key Stage 2 assessments**

The children in Year 6 will be completing their end of key stage assessments next week (Monday—Thursday).

During the week the children will be completing a Grammar, Spelling and Punctuation test, Reading test, an arithmetic test and maths papers 1 & 2. I know the children will do their very best and we wish them the very best of luck.

If your child is in Year 6, please make sure they have a good night's sleep each night so they are able to perform to the best of their ability. We also recommend they bring in water to keep them hydrated.

#### SATS BREAKFAST

Children in Year 6 can come into the school for 8.30am each day of the tests, where they will be offered a SATS breakfast (toast, cereal, fruit juice) to give them extra energy and a calm start to the day.

#### PATHS information session for Parents

There will be an information session for parents regarding the programme we have introduced this year for the children, called PATHS. PATHS stands for Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies and is a highly regarded programme designed to give children knowledge, skills and understanding about emotions, problem solving and self control.

The children are already engaged in the programme and the impact it is having is tangible in school. The programme will work with more impact if parents are aware and involved too. The information session is to raise awareness so parents can support children's emotional and social well-being at home too.

Lisa and Gemma from Barnardo's will be presenting the session.

The session is in the school hall on Tuesday, 13th May at 2.00pm. It will be finished by home time so usual home time arrangements are not affected.
