Thank you to those who attended Monday evening's Parents' Forum. I found the meeting incredibly valuable and appreciate the open, honest feedback shared. One of the main topics we discussed was the school's communication systems—an area that often receives mixed feedback from parents. While questionnaire results generally show that communication is rated as "good" or "very good," some parents shared concerns about the number of different platforms in use, especially for families with more than one child at the school.

With that in mind, we've decided not to renew our contract with Teachers to Parents at the end of this year. Moving forward, we'll be using **School Spider** as our sole platform for messages. To ensure a smooth transition, please make sure you've downloaded the School Spider app. We'll be sending reminders and support to help everyone adjust.

Your feedback truly makes a difference. While some changes take time—like waiting for contracts to expire—I want to reassure you that your suggestions are heard and valued. I will continue to hold Parents' Forum meetings each term and always welcome feedback through our regular questionnaires. If you have ideas or concerns in the meantime, please don't hesitate to get in touch.

Online safety was another important topic raised during our recent discussions. It's clear that this is an area where many parents would welcome further guidance and support. We're committed to working together to keep our children safe online—both in school and at home. We will be providing more information and opportunities for discussion in the near future, so please **watch this space** for upcoming resources and events.
