New school year reminders!

- **We are a nut free school.** Please DO NOT send anything containing nuts to school for lunch or snack time. A number of children have severe allergies to nuts so please be very mindful when purchasing food to send into school.
- Car parking—we are very fortunate to have the facility of a parent area car park but please
 be courteous to other road users and be patient at all times. Please park in a parking bay
 only, do not stop on the left hand side of the entrance to school as this restricts access
 and causes a backlog onto Rainford Road. Also please do not park across residents driveways on St. Thomas Close.
- The car park beyond the gates is for staff only, Parents are not allowed to use the staff car park at any time. Parents must use the parent car park before the school gates.

Beckets 'Out of Hours Club'

Sessions should be booked and paid for in advance via the school money app so that we can manage numbers.

If an occasion arises where you need to book on the day, money should be put onto your account to cover the session as well as the late booking fee prior to contacting school to make the booking.

A reminder that on the day bookings for the Out of Hours Club are for emergencies only.

Any arrears should be cleared prior to using the club.

The charges are below:

Breakfast Club from 7.50am - £5.00

After School Club from 3.10/315pm up to 4.30pm - £6.25

After School Club up until 5.30pm - £8.00

Late Booking Fee (on the day bookings) - £2.50

Please do not drive through the school gates to drop off or pick up children. The car park is for staff only, parents must use the parent car park before the school

IMPORTANT:

Law regarding term time absence from school

You may be aware that the law has now changed regarding penalty notices for unauthorised absence from school. This change came into effect from 19th August 2024.

A letter documenting these changes is attached below Please ensure that you read and keep this letter for future reference.

Application for leave of absence during term time.

From August 2024, the Department for Education issued statutory guidance on school attendance meaning the law was changed regarding holidays during term time.

The head teacher can only grant leave of absence in exceptional circumstances.

Parents applying to remove their child from school during term time must give advance notice and should provide evidence to support the application. (Evidence may include a letter from an employer, or in the case of the Armed Forces or Emergency Services a Superior Officer).

The Head teacher will then consider the application and decide whether to authorise the request or not, based on the evidence given.

Excellent attendance is crucial if children are to fulfil their academic potential. We strongly urge parents not to take children out of school for a holiday during term time.

As a school, we will continue to be proactive in tackling persistent lateness and absenteeism.

Letters to highlight concerns will be sent home to individual parents as a way to improve attendance and punctuality. It is important we work together for the benefit of the children in our care.
