Once completed in class, your child will bring home their form and artwork. This will be by 26th September if not before. If you decide to make an order, you can place orders along with payment online using the unique code located at the top of the pupil order form. All artwork where orders have been placed <u>must</u> be returned to school by: Wednesday 1st October. The designs will then be collected by courier the following day. Cards and products will then be delivered by the beginning of December.

We realise it is early but the 'early bird offer' means the products are a little cheaper and we make a bit more profit for school. The more orders placed, the more money we raise for school.
